DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

Persons using this product shall comply with applicable directions, restrictions, and precautions found on this labeling and that of the label of the federally registered product upon which this amendment is based. This label must be in the possession of the user at the time of pesticide application.

READ THIS LABEL: Read this entire label and follow all use directions and precautions.

IMPORTANT: Do not expose children, pets, or other non-target animals to Rodenticides. To help to prevent accidents:

1. When not in use, store this product in a location out of reach of children and pets.
2. Apply bait in tamper resistant bait stations only. These stations must be resistant to destruction by dogs and children under six years of age, and must be used in a manner that prevents children from reaching into bait compartments and obtaining bait. If bait can be shaken from stations when they are lifted, units must be secured or otherwise immobilized. Stronger bait stations are needed in areas open to hooved livestock or otherwise potentially destructive animals, such as feral pigs, or in areas prone to vandalism.
3. Dispose of product container, unused, spoiled and unconsumed bait, and damaged bait stations, as specified on the label.

USE RESTRICTIONS: For the control only of Indian Mongoose (*Herpestes auropunctatus*), roof rats (*Rattus rattus*), Norway rats (*Rattus norvegicus*), Polynesian rats (*R. exulans*), and house mice (*Mus musculus*) in forests, offshore islands and other non-crop areas to protect native and endangered Hawaiian plants and animals.

Do not apply bait in a manner in which it may contaminate water sources. Do not apply bait in flood prone areas if flooding is expected to occur during the treatment period.

Report signs of secondary poisoning to animals other than Small Indian Mongoose or rodents as well as any occurrences for potential adverse effects such as damaged or vandalized bait boxes, to the Pesticides Branch of the Hawaii Department of Agriculture within 24 hours. (Phone: (808) 973-9401)

ALL users shall consult the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service and provide a written description of their proposed baiting program at least two weeks prior to application. BAITING: Bait stations may be secured on the ground or in trees. Deploy stations in gridlike fashion over the area in which rodent and/or mongoose control is desired. Space stations at intervals of 75 to 150 feet (25-50 meters). Apply 4 to 16 bait squares (4 to 16 ounces of bait) per station. Maintain an uninterrupted supply of fresh bait for at least 10 days or until feeding has stopped. Replace contaminated or spoiled bait immediately. Where a continuous source of infestation is present, permanent bait stations may be established and replenished as needed.

Check area periodically and collect and dispose of any dead animals found. Spoiled or uneaten bait and dead animals collected may be buried on-site or taken to a sanitary landfill for disposal. Burial on-site shall be at a depth such that it will not result in exposure to non-target animals.

Bait stations must have the name and phone number of the responsible agency. Treated areas shall be posted with warning signs stating, "This area has bait stations containing Diphacinone poison to control rodents. If you have any questions, please call ... (808) ..." (Complete sign with name and phone number of the responsible agency.
